
#### **MADDY KINNEY**

### **RUTH BADER GINSBURG:**

Who She is & How Her Death Has Thrown American Politics Into Turmoil By Alayna Coleates

Even after death, Ruth Bader Ginsburg is continuing to make an impact on US politics. Known as a Democratic icon, RBG was known as a leading voice for civil rights, gender equality and women's interests throughout her role as associate justice on the US Supreme Court. The Supreme Court has the final say on highly controversial laws and cases that directly affect the whole country. Now with RBG's recent death and the current president, Donald Trump, insisting on filling her place on the court as soon as possible, the fate of the court's balance is at risk. Donald Trump has recently nominated Amy Coney Barrett, a conservative attorney and jurist, which means that Republicans will have full control of two powers of US government: the Senate and the Supreme Court. What does that mean? It means that immigration, LGBT rights and more will be affected. Most controversial of those is the Roe v Wade case; the case that decides whether abortion remains legal. Republicans have made their stance clear in that they'd like the case to be overturned and abortion to become illegal. If Amy is officially confirmed into the Supreme Court and Republicans have the majority, it's a likely possibility that the Republicans will get their way. To top it all off in March of 2016, Obama's Court nominee was announced "void" by Mitch Mcconnell, a Republican Senate Majority Leader, because he claimed it was too close to the November election 8 months away. Now here we are with Amy Coney Barrett nominated with only around a month till the election. This has left Democrats calling out hypocrisy among the Republicans and with vacancies opening up in the Supreme Court only every so often, this nomination will have a lasting impact; whether Trump is reelected or not.


