
## **ER ALUMNI FOUNDATION – SUMMER 2017**



#### THE SHARING CONTINUES: 10 YEARS OF GRANTS

The East Rochester Alumni Foundation formed in 2005, seeking "to unite the school district, community, and students, and to raise funds and provide grants for programs critical to the education system that are not funded by the school budget." Since the 2006-07 school year, when the Foundation began awarding grants, more than \$115,000 has been donated to help with a variety of diverse and worthy programs, benefiting students from Pre-Kindergarten right up through senior year. The summary below illustrates the numerous long-standing programs and new initiatives for which funds were provided this past school year. These grants continue to demonstrate what a supportive ER family we're extremely proud to be a part of.

**AfterSchool Advantage:** Funds were again donated to help support this popular and highly effective after-school academic-enrichment program for grades 6-12, run by teachers and volunteers.

**Aquatics Special Olympics:** Money was once again provided for t-shirts for ER Bomber athletes and the volunteers/supporters representing our school at the April swim competition.

**'Building Minds in South Sudan':** Funds were granted for this special visit from a young man – one of the Lost Boys of Sudan – to speak to our middle- and high-school students in late April about the challenges he faced and overcame in his long journey to America, and how he has shaped his life here. In his honor, our donation went toward the ongoing construction of schools in South Sudan.

**Elementary Family Superheroes Learning Night:** The goal of this initiative, in its second year, is to engage families in different fun learning opportunities. This year we provided a grant for math, science, and sensory materials and games, along with backpacks and refreshments.

**FITS** (**Fun in the Sun**) **scholarships:** Money was again provided for kids entering grades 1-7 to attend this fun and educational summer-enrichment program.

**Girls with Goals:** The Alumni Foundation was proud to provide a third year of funding for this initiative, which serves to empower girls in grades 7-10 to make important decisions with increased confidence, through intervention and support. This year, two of our Distinguished Alumni Award recipients – the Hon. Vicki Argento '80 and Mary Steigerwald Whittier '83 – also generously donated their time to be guest speakers.

**High School Science Olympiad Team:** For the eighth year, funds were granted to this award-winning team to pay for materials used in competitions. Each year members of the team come to an Alumni Foundation Board meeting to demonstrate some of their entries. Their talent, ingenuity, and hard work is clearly evident.

**Middle-Level Alumni Connection Day:** Funds were donated for t-shirts for this special day in June, when students in grades 6-8 meet with alumni, compete in fun grade-level contests, and enjoy a picnic. (For more information, see page 3.) **Quarterly recognition of Honor Roll students:** Money was again given for lunch-time ice cream sundaes for Junior/Senior High students who earned a spot on the honor or credit rolls.

**Second-grade smoke detectors:** As in 2015-16, funds were provided to help pay for new smoke detectors for our second-graders. This partnership with the ER Fire Department – started as a way to remember and honor Tyler Doohan, who died in January 2014 – allows each child to receive a smoke detector during their annual October visit to the firehouse.

**Senior Bash:** Again this year, funding was granted to help seniors who couldn't otherwise afford to attend this year-end overnight celebration, which encourages them to have safe, responsible, substance-free fun.

**Student of the Month backpacks** – Funds were again used for orange ER backpacks for this program, which honors Junior/Senior High students for making positive contributions to the school community.

**Washington D.C. trips:** Money was donated to the Class of '21 and the Class of '18 (who were unable to go three years ago, as eighth-graders) for admission to the National Aquarium, in Baltimore. This excursion on the way home from our nation's capital has proven to be one of the most popular aspects of the traditional trip.

**'Welcome to ER' Urban-Suburban Picnic:** Funds were once again provided for an August picnic for our new Urban-Suburban students and their families as a way to welcome them to our ER family.

The Alumni Foundation sincerely appreciates all who have supported us, whether through our fundraisers or donations. Together we are providing our students with opportunities that truly help make our District special.



#### ANTHONY CILENTO '57 RECEIVES DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

As part of our Sam Urzetta Alumni Classic awards luncheon on Friday, Aug. 4, the Alumni Foundation proudly honored acclaimed photographer Anthony 'Sonny' Cilento, from the Class of 1957, with its annual Distinguished Alumni Award. A brief biography follows....

From humble beginnings, Anthony Cilento went on to become a major influence in photography and the photographic arts.

Raised by hard-working Italian parents, and struggling academically with what is now known as dyslexia, coupled with the onset of polio in his youth – before any vaccine was discovered – Tony defied all odds when told he



would never walk again. His determination to overcome daunting challenges is something that has never left him.

Tony – also known as 'Sonny' – earned a bachelor's degree from Marquette University, but received his education in total from New York University, Germain School of the Spectrum (now Germain School of Photography), School of Modern Photography, Marquette University, Layton School of the Arts, and Winona School of Photography.

Photography by Cilento opened its doors in Milwaukee in 1962, specializing in school portraiture, weddings, and special events. By the time he sold his company in 1987 to Lifetouch Inc. – the largest photographic company in the world – Tony employed more than 100 individuals. He's served in the prominent role of Lifetouch's Vice-

President of Photographic Development, and has influenced the photographic arts field for more than 50 years. During his tenure at Lifetouch, Tony was the voice of the company's 30,000 full-time and seasonal photographers – an achievement of which he is most proud. He consistently emphasized *why* to photograph over *how* to photograph, creating a culture of "the best photography starts with the heart of photography." People are what

matter – and that's precisely what he cared about most.

Tony's spirit is guided by a strong faith, which he has often turned to throughout his career. Mind-over-matter, inner strength, and his personal faith in God are what have propelled Tony Cilento to help revolutionize an industry, paving the way for countless future photographers.

A representative sample of Tony's celebrity, political, and religious clients includes Frank Sinatra, Neil Diamond, Sting, Diana Ross, Cher, Whitney Houston, The Bee Gees, Fleetwood Mac, Presidents Ford and Reagan, evangelists Dr. Robert A. Schuller and Billy Graham, St. Pope John Paul II, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis I. For a number of years Tony, who is retired and lives near Milwaukee, was also the official photographer for the Green Bay Packers.
